Reform +500+ Anniversary



Out of love for the truth and from desire to elucidate it, the Reverend Father Martin Luther, Master of Arts and Sacred Theology, and ordinary lecturer therein at Wittenberg, intends to defend the following statements and to dispute on them in that place. Therefore he asks that those who cannot be present and dispute with him orally shall do so in their absence by letter. In the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, Amen.

Martin Luther's Preamble to his 95 Theses posted October 31, 1517

The Reformation began with Martin Luther placing his ninety-five articles of dispute on the door of the Wittenberg Church in Germany. If you go to that church today, or do a google search, you will see that a cast bronze church door now carries the impression of all 95 Theses. A fun way to say this is heavy stuff.

When you read these articles today, you quickly realize why Luther's life was **Reformation** at risk when he set his channenge before the result of strong rhetoric. You might ther loaded these articles with language full of strong rhetoric. You might at risk when he set his challenge before the Roman Catholic authorities. Luthink Luther was trying to say in as many ways as possible, "No! You are wrong!!!" with about 90 additional exclamation points. Also if you sit and read this whole document from beginning to end, you begin to notice a pro-

gression in Luther's argument. Each thesis connects with the one before it along with the thesis that follows. Luther organized purpose and logic to his argument.

Our Reformation Planning Committee has come up with a fun way to get you to read at least some of the 95 Theses. We invite you to sponsor a thesis or two at the dollar amount of that particular article. During May, we will post all of them on the door in our narthex for you to read and find one that you like, or amuses you, or catches your attention.

So for example, for 8 dollars you could sponsor thesis number 8:

The penitential canons are imposed only on the living, and, according to the canons themselves, nothing should be imposed on the dying.

Or for 93 dollars you could sponsor thesis number 93:

Blessed be all those prophets who say to the people of Christ, "Cross, cross," and there is no cross!

If you are like me, you will pick a number close to the dollar amount you want to contribute and upon reading the thesis decide, "I think I will choose something different." The committee would like to limit each thesis to one sponsor, but this is for fun. Pick one or pick three, share with someone or stand out on vour own.

Funds raised will be used to throw a party, host a Reformation worship service, and make a donation to the glory of God. Happy 500th Anniversary!


Music Feeds Us
