On Sunday evening, Christ Lutheran kicked off the fall portion of our Reformation 500 Commemoration. Twenty-one people gathered in the fellowship hall for dinner and a movie. We ate brats and sauerkraut, with a variety of side dishes. After dinner, we watched *Luther* a 2003 movie starring Joseph Fiennes as Martin Luther. The movie covers the period of time from Luther's ordination up to the presentation of the Augsburg Confession by the princes of Germany to Emperor Charles V.

Inside our newsletter (page 7), you will find a calendar of events marking this years celebration, culminating with a joint worship service on Sunday, October 29 at 4:00 P.M. with Bishop Robert Humphrey. I hope you can find time to participate in a few of the events over the next few months.

At the same time this fall, Christ Lutheran celebrates our Pony Express Fall Stewardship Event. All year our council and finance committee have reflected about and prayed for how we care for the gifts that God has given us. That includes caring for our faith, our church, creation, and our relationships with one another. My thanks goes out to the Stewardship Committee who spent the better part of 6 months preparing for this event. I pray that their enthusiasm for the Pony Express is contagious.

#### PONY EXPRESS FOR OUR CHRIST LUTHERAN MISSION



Hopefully you have heard something about our Pony Express Program, but perhaps you still have some questions. I will try to anticipate some of those questions and give you information to clarify the program.

#### WHO does the Pony Express involve?

Everyone. No matter who is in the family, each couple and person should complete an Intentional Giving Card. This is a very nice way to involve our children in financial responsibility and management of their resources as well as the total life of the church.

#### WHAT is Pony Express?

The Pony Express program is designed to help each member of our congregation to think about how much your budget can be designated in 2018 for the work of the church. This is to encourage you to be **intentional** about your offering each Sunday and being able to plan ahead. This allows you the opportunity to fulfill that responsibility whether you are present every Sunday for service or not.

#### WHEN is the Pony Express going to run?

We will begin the pony express on September 24 at a lunch after our Sunday Service. We want as many people to join for this "kick-off" as possible and have an exciting send off of our pony express teams. The "run" should be completed in 4-6 weeks and sooner if the members of the team forward the saddlebag as quick as possible.

#### **HOW does it work?**

We have our congregation divided into geographical teams. The saddle bag has 2 pouches. The pouch labeled "Christ Lutheran Pony Express" contains envelopes to place your "Intentional Giving Card" after your have given thoughtful prayer to helping fulfill the obligations of our congregation and completed the information requested on the card.

After completing the card, you will place the Intentional Giving Card in the envelope, seal the envelope and place it in the "Thank You" side of the saddlebag.

On the reverse side of the pouch, there is a list of your team, which will help you decide who to ride the bag to next. The process should take no more than 48 hours-- quicker is better. If you cannot pass it on, call your station manager listed on the roster, and they will get one of the volunteer riders to pick up the bag and move it on to the next person. PLEASE, do not let the mail pouch stop at your station! We do ask that you call your station manager and let them know that it has been passed on.

There will be some individuals who will receive a mailing rather than the mail pouch. This is necessitated for those who may live too far away or those that we haven't seen for a long time and we want to invite to come back to our family.

#### HOW is this different from a traditional Stewardship program?

The Pony Express depends on the involvement of every member of our congregation, but is not a visitation program. Each person will determine their own "Intentional Giving" without the pressure of having someone in your home asking for your pledge. I think it is a fun, low pressure, and total involvement program designed to help each person think about intentional giving to assure the mission of the church will be fulfilled.

#### **HOW** will the information be used?

The information from the Intentional Giving card will be reviewed by the treasurer and Financial Chair and the data will then be summarized as a total. There will be no individual information published or tracked. Our only intention this year is to know how many families are contacted, what percentage respond and the total amount that people plan to give. These totals will be shared with the congregation, but no individual information will be shared.

#### WHAT if I can't do what I commit to?

Again, to emphasize, this is to help individual members think about intentional giving for 2018. We all know that life changes happen. Sometimes things get better and you might want to give more than you thought you could. Sometimes things get worse and you might not be able to give as much as you thought. And sometimes things stay the same and you can give exactly what you thought! In other words, this is a guideline that you decide and is not a "bill" that you will be held to by any kind of tracking system.

#### LET THE RACE BEGIN

We will keep track of the order that our relay teams make it to the finish line. Try to get yours to the church first. Maybe we will even have a photo finish! Thank you for involvement and we hope this will be an exciting stewardship campaign for each of you.


